I would like to express my support for this application. The rear area of the property has clearly always functioned as a garden space. Since the current owners moved in, it has been used in a completely normal and appropriate way for a family garden - including children playing, light sports activities, planting, and family picnics.

The addition of a small play area and zip wire does not alter the character of the land; it simply enhances its established use as a family garden.

The play equipment appears safe, well-constructed and responsibly installed. It is contained within the property's boundaries and appropriately screened, ensuring there is no harmful overlooking or loss of privacy to neighbouring properties.

In terms of impact, this is entirely typical of residential living. The level of noise associated with children playing outdoors is minimal and wholly consistent with what one would reasonably expect within a family neighbourhood. Supporting opportunities for children to be active outdoors - rather than confined indoors on electronic devices - is something that benefits both families and the wider community.

There is no material harm arising from this use, and it remains fully in keeping with the character of the area. I respectfully trust that, in exercising your authority and professional judgment, you will apply a fair, proportionate and common-sense approach to this application.
