Comments:

I wish to strongly object to the proposed planning application for additional residential dwellings. The current road network in the area is already overburdened, with frequent congestion and inadequate road widths to safely accommodate existing traffic volumes. Adding further housing will significantly worsen these issues, increasing the risk of accidents and making travel times longer for residents. Moreover, there is no provision in the application for essential supporting infrastructure, such as additional school places, expanded healthcare facilities, or improved public transport links. The local services are already stretched, and further population growth without these vital upgrades will place unsustainable pressure on the community. This development would therefore have a detrimental impact on road safety, quality of life, and the overall sustainability of the area. Instead of more housing in this location, a public outdoor space for the community - such as a park, play area, or green recreational space - would provide much-needed environmental, social, and health benefits for the area, supporting wellbeing without overburdening infrastructure.
