ago for that exact reason.

The principle cause of our objection is that the proposal is to change quiet a footpath/driveway with probably 5 vehicles on it a day to an actual road with all the associated noise, traffic, pollution and disturbance. Many dog walkers let their dogs off lead on this path and it is a peaceful and tranquil location. Changing this to a road will also mean we hear traffic noise inside our house for the first time which is a significant noise disturbance.

I'm not sure if this can be relevant to our objection, but the proposed land regularly floods in wet weather and the water runs down the pathway near our house. We would therefore also have concerns as to whether the proposal would adversely affect how this excess water is currently managed. There is an email from Southern Water on the planning site but I cannot see their response as it is an attachment.

I hope that our views on the significant effect this would have on our lives are well received.
