Comments: This a rural area, Thakeham is a village, not a town. Storrington Road has to cope with too much traffic as it is. The road is narrow and winding and with endless extra traffic will become even more dangerous especially at night and/or in poor weather. It is poorly maintained with many potholes and will deteriorate further under the pressure of construction vehicles and

traffic from 150 new homes.

There are no plans for the infrastructure needed to serve a community with the number of extra people 150 homes will involve. Thakeham has no doctors' surgery, no nursery, no pre-school and the primary school has been moved to Sullington! There is one small shop. This lack of infrastructure means people having to drive to Storrington or further afield to access services. Whilst the elderly may access such things as a community minibus, it is disingenuous to suggest that other sections of the community will do so, they will drive their children and themselves to and fro as needed. It is obvious that the roads are in no way safe for cycling.

If there are to be any houses on this site there should be far fewer.
