Comments:	I do not believe either of the two proposed road accesses to be appropriate or safe. These are narrow country lanes already struggling to safely accommodate the existing volume of traffic. The additional heavy construction traffic and the potential addition of some 100 cars from the completed development is not sustainable or safe on narrow pot-holed country lanes
	This is greenfield agricultural land and would represent a

significant loss of amenity. Surely given the constraints imposed by natural England's water neutrality requirements the District Council should focus on brownfield development which has the capacity to attract government funding to support meeting infrastructure needs.

There are properties within the conservation area in this village that are already at risk of flooding due to an overwhelmed existing surface water drainage system. My own home has flooded twice due to lack of adequate surface water drainage and have been told by WSCC that the system will not support the addition of more drains to deal with this surface water appropriately and safely. It must follow therefore that the system will not be able to accommodate the additional road surface water drains required as part of this new development which will exacerbate existing flooding and the bottom of Tillets Lane, in Church Street and in other parts of the village.

For the above reasons I strongly oppose the development of this particular site.
