The increased noise is not just construction traffic but also the amount of additional cars and vans once occupied. Light pollution, destruction of an abundant wildlife area, the list goes on.

The known flooding in the fields have not been addressed with rivers of water coming off the fields on to the roads leading down Knob Hill.

This is a well loved, quiet haven used by wildlife and villagers alike. This new development will change the village forever and not for the better. There are numerous housing developments surrounding our village.
