Comments:	Whilst I do not object to the new planned housing development I do object to the amendment to make Carter Drive a through road for the following reasons

Carter Drive is a narrow winding road with blind corners and in some parts only wide enough for one car a significant increase in traffic would be dangerous.

In parts there are no pathways and where there are paths they are not very wide so increased traffic would be hazardous for pedestrians especially the many school children who walk to school that route.

Carter Drive has not been formally adopted by the council and through a management company the current residents pay for the maintenance of the road and the street lighting costs does the proposed alterations mean the council would adopt the road and bear the costs.

As previously mentioned Carter Drive is a narrow road and as such some of the houses are very close to the actual road so would adversely be effected by a doubling of the amount of traffic. Their quality of enjoyment of their home would be adversely effected by increased noise and traffic pollution.

Not all residents were formally advised of the planned amendment which they should have been as in effect the amount of traffic will at least be doubled to what it is now.
