Comments: I am writing to formally object to the proposed Bellway development of 150 houses on the site of the old mushroom farm in Thakeham.

My primary concern is the severe and unacceptable impact this development would have on Storrington Road. This road is

already extremely busy and struggles to cope with existing levels of traffic, particularly during peak periods. It is narrow, poorly maintained, and in many places is not wide enough for two large vehicles to pass safely. Adding traffic generated by 150 new homes would significantly worsen congestion, pollution, and noise for existing residents.

Storrington Road is already heavily used by a wide variety of vehicles, including buses, tractors and other agricultural vehicles, builders' lorries, and heavy goods vehicles that use the road as a shortcut to avoid the A24 Washington Roundabout. This creates a challenging and sometimes hazardous situation even under current conditions. The addition of construction traffic, including heavy lorries and plant machinery, would make the road frankly dangerous. The presence of deep potholes further compounds the risk to motorists, cyclists, pedestrians, and local residents.

Beyond the construction phase, the permanent increase in daily traffic from 150 households will inevitably place further strain on this unsuitable road network. This will negatively affect safety, air quality, and the overall character of the village.

Furthermore, I am concerned that the proposal makes no provision for additional community services or infrastructure. There is no mention of new shops, medical facilities, or other essential amenities. Thakeham does not currently have sufficient local services to support a development of this scale. In particular, there are no nurseries or schools in the village, and the nearest facilities are already oversubscribed. This means children will have to be transported by road, adding yet more traffic to an already overstretched network.

In summary, this development would:

- Significantly increase traffic, pollution, and noise on Storrington Road.
- Create serious safety risks due to construction traffic on a narrow, damaged road.
- Exacerbate congestion caused by existing heavy and shortcutting vehicles.
- Place unacceptable pressure on already inadequate local infrastructure and services.

For these reasons, I strongly object to the proposed development and urge the planning authority to refuse permission unless these fundamental issues are properly addressed with robust and realistic solutions.
