Comments:	Dear Sir / Madam,  I am writing to express my support for this planning application. As a neighbour to the field I believe that the proposed application has the potential to have a positive impact on the area in a number of ways.

Currently, the field has an entrance located to the South, which unfortunately suffers from limited visibility. This situation is manageable for cars and light vehicles; however, it poses challenges for larger agricultural type vehicles that need access to the field. Furthermore, UK Power Networks requires annual entry to the field for their multiple vehicles to manage the hedgerow and maintain essential high voltage equipment for the local area. Creating an entrance that offers improved visibility would not only enhance safety for any field traffic, but also promote safer conditions for all road users.

Additionally, the proposed hedgerow featuring mixed native plant species would significantly improve the visual appeal and character along Rock Road. More importantly, it would help with the preservation of local wildlife.

I support this application, as I feel this would have a positive impact on the local area.
