Comments:	This proposed development is in a beautiful scenic area, which is not in the neighbourhood plan nor within an existing built-up area. It is graced by many old trees, oaks in particular. The implementation of this development will detract from the rural aspect and may well risk the future health of the many mature

specimens found in the area. The area is prone to flooding; there is no mains drainage, sewage or gas supply. The site is poorly served by a narrow, dead end lane, accessed mainly from Henfield Village, where the narrowness of Church Street is a known bottleneck, and will struggle to accommodate more vehicles, particularly large vans and caravans/trailers. There is no public transport in West End Lane. People use West End Lane for recreational purposes - walking, cycling, running, riding. There are no pavements and visibility in some areas overhung by trees is poor, especially at dusk. Increasing traffic increases the risk of an accident. Everyone using West End Lane would have to pass the development, which would be totally out of character with the area. I strongly object to this development and respectfully request that the views of the people of Henfield are taken into account when the Council considers its decision.
