**Comments:** Many houses (1-10) park on the road outside their houses as they don't have driveways big enough, if you put the entrance there it will cause major parking issues as we won't have anywhere else to park. In addition to this the lay-by which you have decided to use as the entrance is a parking place for many residents in houses 1-10 due to lack of space. By putting the entrance there you are not only getting rid of road parking but lay-by parking which would cause massive problems for current residents including myself as many houses have more than 2 cars.

The entrance is also opposite my house so car headlights would shine directly into the front windows causing disturbance

38 houses would also increase an already congested area on a very small road. The

congestion would also increase noises outside my house causing more disturbances. Congestion may also become a safety issue as many young children live in the surrounding houses and walk to the junior school. There would also be loss of wildlife including the Nightingale which are classified as a red list species under the category of rare. Currently Hayes Lane has a very well known drainage issue with the road flooding with any heavy rain. More impermeable surfaces like tarmac would make the flooding worse and also increase the risk of flooding in lighter rain.
