FURTHER CONDITIONS

Natural England currently has no comment to make on the removal of condition 3.

Sussex North Water Supply Zone

This development site is within the Sussex North Water Supply Zone.

In September 2021, Natural England issued a position statement advising that abstraction within this zone could not be ruled out as having an adverse effect on the integrity of Arun Valley Special Area of Conservation (SAC), Special Protection Area (SPA) and Ramsar site.

On 31st October 2025, Natural England withdrew this position statement on the basis that a collaborative solution had been agreed between Southern Water, the Environment Agency and Natural England to secure the designated site's integrity. It is therefore our advice that your authority **does not** need to undertake a Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) or consult us on water scarcity issues affecting the Arun Valley sites moving forwards.

If any of the conditions relate to protected species, please note the following:

We have not assessed this application and associated documents for impacts on protected species.

Natural England has produced [standing advice^{\[1\]}](#) to help planning authorities understand the impact of particular developments on protected species. We advise you to refer to this advice. Natural England will only provide bespoke advice on protected species where they form part of a Site of Special Scientific Interest or in exceptional circumstances.
