Comments:	I object in the strongest possible terms. The land I was told was sold without permission for building. Had that not been the case the neighbourhood may have bought that strip of land to prevent any such build. Any build on this green space will significantly reduce green space ratio in our neighbourhood, with levels already at an unacceptable low. Many people rely on this space

for walking, exercise, sport and mental wellbeing, as well as picnics, socialising, etcetera - especially in the warmer months of the year.

Furthermore, any development on this strip of land will impact on the view from my property, will impact the already congested parking, will negatively impact existing infrastructure, and will decrease the value of my property.

Finally, there is already water logging at the lower end of the field parallel to the railway line, to the extent of a pond now developing. How building an unwanted property at the top of the slope will impact this drainage problem I am not sure, but almost certainly it will have a further negative impact which might even affect the railway line - maybe even subsidence which is known in the area.
