Comments:	Original plans for application ref: DC/25/0894, whilst not the most welcome were considerate to the existing residents of Carter Drive, with no through access into the new estate and reasonable planned distance and separation between the existing

development and the new proposed development. The new plans recently submitted are entirely unacceptable, the new buildings are now direction on the Carter Drive roadway, which is managed and maintained by the development managing agent which we pay for, therefore is not property that the Council can use as part of their plans for any building or parking space designs without agreement from the existing residents that pay for its maintenance. If this is to be accessed by the new development we would expect to be advised appropriately and compensated for the use of this driveway maintained by residents. The current roadways are also already inadequately sized and to add further strain on these is irresponsible and dangerous. The new plans submitted are overbearing on the existing estate and this was promised to not happen and is therefore fundamentally dishonest on the part of the planning applicant. I whole heartedly object to this proposal and will consider review
