Reasons for comment:	- Design - Highway Access and Parking - Loss of General Amenity - Overdevelopment - Privacy Light and Noise
Comments:	I wish to strongly object to this proposal for the following reasons. The entrance/exit to the site is on a blind bend and is already very dangerous to drivers and pedestrians.

If approved the track leading to the site (which is also a public footpath) would be used c.5,000 times a year, making accidents inevitable.

Furthermore it is flooded on a regular basis and is impassable to pedestrians let alone vehicles.

The manoeuvrability of caravans and vehicles transporting them would be impossible on this unmade piece of track.

Approval of this site would mean there are 3 traveller sites within a radius of 170m. Approving this application will fundamentally change the area and way of life for the existing residents.

There is a small bungalow next to the site, if there were c.5,000 vehicle movements per year, the life of the resident would be badly impacted.

The site is next to the railway line where train horns, in excess of 80 decibels, are sounded from 6 am in the morning until 11 pm at night. The sound of the horns is a major issue.

The surrounding road has no pavements and is already dangerous for pedestrians, another 5,000 vehicle movements a year would increase that danger, it is particularly unsuitable for children needing to walk to a bus stop to catch a bus to school.
