HORSHAM DISTRICT COUNCIL CONSULTATION

LOCATION:	Land North of Little Slaughterford, Chapel Road, Barns Green, West Sussex
DESCRIPTION:	Proposed development of 68 dwellings with vehicular and pedestrian accesses, public open space, hard and soft landscaping and associated works including supporting foul and surface water drainage works, and works to existing culverted watercourse on site.

RECOMMENDATION:	Advice / No Objection / Objection / More Information / Modification / Refusal
SUMMARY OF COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATION: The application is supported by a desk based archaeological assessment produced by TCMS Heritage that concludes that the site has a high to moderate archaeological potential for the medieval and post medieval periods and that further archaeological investigations are required to clarify the nature, extent and significance of any archaeological deposits. In this case it would be reasonable to secure the work with an archaeological condition	
MAIN COMMENTS: The application is supported by a desk based archaeological assessment produced by TCMS Heritage that has used appropriate sources, including the West Sussex HER, to determine that the site has a high to moderate potential for post medieval and medieval archaeological remains with a lower potential for earlier periods. A geophysical survey of the site is included in the report, and this recorded several anomalies which are potentially of an archaeological nature. In order to clarify the nature, extent and significance of any archaeological deposits that may be present the report considers that further investigations may be required. I can confirm that this is correct and that in the first instance an archaeological field evaluation of the site would be appropriate which enable suitable mitigation measures to be developed for the site should significant archaeology be discovered. In this case I consider that it would be reasonable and proportionate to secure the required archaeological investigations and any subsequent mitigation that may be required by attaching the following condition should planning consent be granted.	

ANY RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS:**Pre-Commencement Condition:**

i) No development shall take place until a programme of archaeological work has been secured in accordance with a Written Scheme of Archaeological Investigation which has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

ii) The development hereby permitted shall not be commenced until the archaeological site investigation and post investigation assessment has been completed in accordance with the programme set out in the Written Scheme of Investigation approved under condition [i] and that provision for analysis, publication and dissemination of results and archive deposition has been secured and approved by the Local Planning Authority in writing.

Reason: As this matter is fundamental as the site is of archaeological significance and it is important that it is recorded by excavation before it is destroyed by development in accordance with Policy 34 of the Horsham District Planning Framework (2015)
