Comments:	<p>I do not object as such, but I would like to register the following comments for consideration.</p> <p>As the neighbouring property to this one, I would like to state that these 17th /18th Century historic buildings were not built for modern living and as such, there are a number of things that need to be planned for and taken into account when converting this property into a domestic dwelling.</p> <p>I would like to request consideration is given to the issue of noise</p>

and disturbance and that some level of sound-proofing be factored into the conversion plans. As it stands at this time, noise from one dwelling travels to the other as if we were all together in the same room. There are areas in my home, where I can quite literally see the daylight from No.11.

When someone is talking in the buildings adjacent to mine, I can hear the conversations and noise as clearly as if I were there. We all naturally make a certain amount of noise, which is understandable, but when you can hear your neighbours conversations (literally word for word), their television and music, even when played at a normal and very reasonable level, this does have an impact.
