Comments:	I am very worried the impact this proposal will have on the road. Access will be on the corner of a poor visibility turning on the road as you go under the railway bridge. This is a dangerous bit of Gay Street Lane to drive already without 6 additional households worth of traffic joining it on the corner, which in my opinion will cause

more accidents.

I regularly walk down the footpath which will become the access point for this site and know that it is currently a very natural area with only two properties (one at either end) to build a 6 static caravan site will completely change the usage of this natural land, destroying more of our wild space used by native animals, this is a big concern for me as we have a very countryside environment on Gay Street Lane which benefits a range of wildlife but seems to be at risk of being eroded.

My final objection is to do with water. The paths down this proposed location already get very flooded, with hard standings covering more of the land I fear this will only get worse which will have a bigger impact on the whole area.
