| Comments: | <p>I would like to object to the proposed first floor extension at Unit 1, 7 Littlehaven Lane. There have been multiple planning applications for this property and all have been objected to many times for the same reasons, overdevelopment and lack of light and privacy, and this is again an issue.</p> <p>The layout of the houses surrounding this property means that at least 11 houses back onto it, all of which would be impacted in terms of privacy, light and overdevelopment if this went ahead. The extension would cause significant blocking of light and</p> |

privacy for numbers 5 and 7 Littlehaven Lane due to the close proximity of the houses to the unit as the gardens are very small. The windows and garden areas in the proposed plans would also impact the houses adjoining the property along Crawley Road, Innes Road and Perth Way.

This area is already as developed as it can be, and adding a second storey to this unit will alter the look of the area as well as cause a significant negative impact on the properties and occupants to the surrounding houses.

As it stands the unit produces a fair amount of noise and coming and going of vehicles which causes some disruption, particularly in the summer when windows are open, and adding another residential unit with additional parking to this will only add to that.
